Judge Thomas D. Gladden, the retired President Judge of the Washington County Court of Common Pleas, is a native of McDonald, PA.

After graduating from McDonald High School (now Fort Cherry) he earned his Bachelor of Arts from Allegheny College, his Juris Doctor from the Dickinson School of Law, his L.L.D. from Washington & Jefferson College. He served in the U.S. Army from 1957 to 1959.

The Judge is a member of the Washington County and PA Bar Associations, the Pennsylvania Trial Judges' Conference, and is a former member of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court Criminal Procedural Rules Committee.

The Judge is the Past President of the Rotary Club of Washington, a member of the Sons of the American Revolution, the Pennsylvania Society, and the International Churchill Society and has served as Secretary of Community Living of United Cerebral Palsy (now Pathways of Southwestern Pennsylvania). The Judge is a member of the St. Andrews Society of Pittsburgh and of the WCCF's *James H. McCune Acorn Society*.
