Audric Dodds is the Director of Community Relations and Strategic Partnerships at CNX. Prior to joining CNX, Audric served in numerous roles at EQT over his 13 year tenure. In his new role he will be responsible for generating support for CNX's public policy agenda, strategically coordinating and leading efforts to advance public policy priorities and working with operational and technical support teams within the company to advance and protect CNX's social license to operate.

Audric's community service includes previously serving as the Membership Vice-Chair of the Laurel Highlands Scoutreach Board and participating on the boards of the Boy Scouts of America Laurel Highlands Council and the Adonai Center for Black Males. Audric currently serves on the Pittsburgh Chamber of Commerce board of directors. Audric has spent the last 11 years as a mentor to high school juniors and seniors through EQT's ASPIRE mentorship program and the CNX Mentorship Academy.

Elizabeth I. Guerrieri is Vice President/Marketing and Public Relations for Washington Financial Bank, a \$1.6 billion financial institution headquartered in Washington, Pa. She also serves as the Executive Director of the Bank's Foundation, The Washington Financial Charitable Foundation. Elizabeth oversees all marketing and advertising communications for Washington Financial Bank as well as all public relations and media. In her role as Executive Director, she is responsible for managing the Foundation's budget, reviewing grant requests for Board approval and managing the Foundation's scholarship program. Elizabeth has been employed by Washington Financial for 38 years, serving in both the Administrative and Marketing Divisions of the Bank.



Christina Kramer has been with Range Resources since 2014. At Range, Christina's primary focus is on the planning and execution of the company's community relations, public affairs outreach, and charitable giving initiatives in southwestern Pennsylvania. Christina serves on the Board of Directors of Dress for Success Pittsburgh, and special committees for Transitional Paths to Independent Living, Junior Achievement of Western PA and the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. In 2020, she received the Junior Achievement Inspiring Success Award in the Science, Engineering, Production and Technology category.



Ellen Rossi serves as President of the EQT Foundation, the philanthropic extension of EQT Corporation, the nation's largest natural gas producer, headquartered in Pittsburgh, PA. With Ellen's oversight, the EQT Foundation awards more than \$3M a year to organizations throughout Appalachia whose missions are primarily focused on community enrichment, education & workforce, and the environment. Ellen frequently collaborates with the nonprofit community and schools to help guide and develop strategic partnerships for funding that enable communities to prosper and open pathways for our future workforce. In addition to overseeing the EQT Foundation, Ellen manages all community investment programs at EQT Corporation, including employee engagement opportunities.



Betsie Trew is the President & CEO of the Washington County Community Foundation, a position created by the Board of Trustees in December of 2010. Hired by the WCCF Board of Trustees in 1998, she was the Foundation's first Executive Director. Under her leadership, the assets of the Foundation have grown from less than \$250,000 to more than \$50 million, with over \$25 million in grants and scholarships awarded. During her tenure, the WCCF was one of the first community foundations in the country to be approved for the National Standards for Community Foundations. She also led the effort to initiate WCCF Gives, an annual community-wide day of giving that supports over 100 local charities. Most recently, Trew led the WCCF's efforts to create the Close to Home Disaster & Emergency Fund, which cumulatively has provided over \$700,000 in grants to local nonprofits working to address the impacts of the COVID-19 virus in our community.
